In writing, LKS2 have been working on using causal conjunctions to help them


write explanations about the formation of mountains. They have al done brilliantly.



Year 5 and 6


UKS2 have been focusing on using the past perfect tense in their writing based on The Lighthouse animation. The children have been able to use this complex grammar feature superbly and with skill.

In history, the children have been learning about the Silk Road and its importance to trade within and beyond the Islamic world.




French
