EYFS Updates

Reception have been looking at the life cycles of Sunflowers and the work of Vincent Van Gogh and other artists who painted sunflowers. They have explored using different tools such as brushes and forks to create textures in their sunflower paintings. They have planted sunflower seeds (as well as broad beans) to notice the roots and shoots as they grow into seedlings and then plants, and have observed the changes in the sunflowers that they painted as they come to the end of their life and the petals fall off.

Year 1 and 2

KS2 French

Year 3/4

This half term the children have been learning to talk and write about sports and activities. They linked this with their knowledge of days of the week to write a diary of activities.

They also learned how to say the date in French by using days, numbers to 31 plus the months.

The children had a fun lesson recently all about le Tour de France (which started on July 1st). They learned about time trials, the peleton, riders jerseys & much more. Everyone loved the video of last year's Tour highlights - especially the crashes – as well as designing their own Tour rider's jersey.
