What a fantastic and busy start to the new academic year. The children have all settled really well into their new classes, and have had some wonderful learning opportunities and exciting trips and visits.

The term started with an enjoyable theatre visit and performance of Alice in Wonderland. The theatre company engaged brilliantly with the children and brought the world of Lewis Carroll to life.

Our Year 5 and 6 children, and some Year 3s, had the opportunity to undertake a 4-week rugby training programme with Leicester Tigers. This involved practical sessions with a coach, and theory work in the classroom. The children had a great time and worked hard to improve their skills.



Twenty children in Year 5 volunteered to be trained as playground leaders. Mr Grundy from Robert Smyth Academy spent a morning teaching them some new games to make playtimes more fun and enjoyable. The children have now worked out their work rota and have started to run sessions at break and lunchtimes.

Last week in assembly time, the children were reminded about the types of healthy snacks we have during break times at Ridgeway, namely fruit or a plain biscuit. It is hoped that children will avoid eating items that are processed and/or generate rubbish with their wrappers. This will help keep the school environment clean and tidy and hopefully help promote healthy choices.

Can I thank all of you for making sure the children look great in their school uniform every day. Most children are remembering when to wear PE kit or uniform on the correct days, although it is important that everyone remembers that trainers should **only** be worn on PE days. At the beginning

EYFS Updates

The children in Reception have made a fantastic start to their learning journey and have settled really well into life at Ridgeway Academy. They have already learnt so much in such a small amount of time.

In phonics, they are applying their initial sounds brilliantly to build CVC words especially when segmenting and blending in their reading, and in maths they have worked really well at noticing patterns around us, and building repeat patterns.

The children have really enjoyed finding out about themselves and their new friends, and have learnt some wonderful Autumn poems. As always, the children love exploring the outside space, and they will have a great time when they begin forest school sessions next half term.



Year 1 and 2

The children in KS1 have had a super start to the Autumn Term.

In writing they have focussed on the tale of Dick Whittington ensuring they are using sentence punctuation and descriptive vocabulary to bring their story alive for the reader.

In Maths, they have concentrated on their understanding of place value and developing the concept of one more and one less.

The science focus has been on plants and trees, culminating a fabulous local visit to Great Bowden Park. Fun was definitely had by all.

The children's mapping skills were a developed further through building wonderful 3D maps of their classroom.








Year 3 and 4
