Impact of PPG 2017/18	
<p>100% of pupils in receipt of pupil premium reached GLD at the end of EYFS</p> <p>50% of children in receipt of pupil premium met the required standard in phonics at the end of KS1 and 100% by the end of KS2.</p> <p>25% of pupils in receipt of pupil premium reached the expected standard in reading , writing and maths at the end of KS1.</p> <p>At the end of KS2 Progress of disadvantaged group was -1.51 in reading +5.65 in writing and -1.6 in maths . 33% attained EXS in reading and maths and 66% EXS in writing.</p> <p>Children had opportunities to attend breakfast club and to settle prior to school starting. The school worked closely with parents to support those children with additional needs.</p>	

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
