Impact of PE and Sports Grant 2106/17	
<p>The PE and Sports funding has contributed to the provision of high quality PE and sport at Ridgeway Primary Academy. Pupils' levels of physical activity have increased and performance in local sporting competitions has improved. This success has also had an impact on levels of self-confidence and self-esteem for all pupils, which contributes, in turn, to improving levels of achievement across the curriculum.</p> <p>Coaching sessions: The overall impact of the coaching sessions has been positive. There are many strong ideas that can be implemented within our practice to improve the quality of PE teaching. The coaches provide a good structure for the teachers to follow, and this is usually positive, depending on the experience that the teachers have. The children are able to use the correct language when discussing PE and are very positive towards their sessions.</p> <p>Extra-curricular: The netball team finished in 2nd place in South Leicestershire. The 3/4/5/6 children entered the Area Sports where we finished 8th out of 13 schools. All of KS1 went to Robert Smyth where they attended a multi-skills morning. Thirty Year 4 children attended a mini Olympic event at Robert Smyth. There are a good range of activities that have taken place.</p>
