

Arrangements for Reporting to Parents

Aims

At Ridgeway Primary Academy our aim is to give parents useful information throughout the year so they can fully participate in their child's progress and learning.

We want the reports we give to parents over the course of the year to be useful working documents and as such comply with the following legislation:

As such we have an annual reporting cycle to parents.

Our Annual Reporting Cycle

Autumn Term

 Drop in Parents' Evening: an opportunity to discuss with the class teacher how children have settled in (usually held September/ October)

Spring Term

- Narrative progress report to parents detailing the child's achievements in school to date, with a focus on progress since the last report and the next steps that the child needs to take throughout the remainder of the year. This report forms the basis of discussions at the Spring Parents' Evening
- Spring Term Parents' Evening. This focuses on the report, the child's progress and next steps.

Summer Term

- Table report that outlines achievement in each subject and attitudes to learning. It also shows whether appropriate progress has been made. The report details attendance data and will include results of Key Stage tests received. (KS2 test results are not received until the last week of term so these are sent separately.)
- Summer Term Parents' Evening. This is an opportunity to discuss progress made against the next steps detailed in the Spring Report and to discuss progress and achievements over the year.

Throughout the year

 Parents are welcome to make an appointment with their child's class teacher at any time during the year to discuss their child's attainment, progress, personal development and well-being.
